Jumping Through Fires

During the 1979 Revolution in Iran, David Nasser, his parents and siblings made their escape from their native land when it became clear that as supporters of the shah, their lives were in danger. David, who was just 9 years old, was frightened and bewildered at having to leave his home, his friends and everything that was familiar to him. Finally after many terrifying experiences the family arrived in Texas, America.

The rest of David's story tells of his cultural adjustments, of his mistakes, of his embarrassments and of his eventually coming to a very real faith in Jesus.

David now lives with his wife Jennifer and their two children in Alabama and is in demand as a speaker at conferences, rallies and special events.

This book is enlightening, challenging and often humorous.
